Dear Valued Participant,

Thank you for expressing your interest in joining the NIHR BioResource. We appreciate your willingness to contribute to health research. Your unique perspective and insights are crucial to ensuring that our panel of volunteers reflect the diversity of the UK population, and therefore health research. To get started, we kindly request your cooperation in the following steps:

- Kindly take a moment to review and sign the consent form, showing your willingness to participate.
- We ask that you provide your personal information, including your name, date of birth, NHS/CHI number, and contact details.
- Your data is anonymised, personal details kept separate from other information, and stored in a secure data centre.
- Complete a questionnaire about your health and lifestyle. Your input helps researchers understand how genetics and environment affect health.
- Grant us permission to collect, store, and analyse health-related information about you. This may involve accessing your medical records, other healthrelated records, and, if necessary, educational and social care records from sources like NHS Digital and other databases. We are fully committed to handling all health information with the utmost sensitivity and adhere to the strictest regulations, guidelines and best practices for doing so.

Contact Information

 Provide a small sample of either blood (approximately 3-4 teaspoons) at an appointment at one of our 18 centres across England, or saliva via post.

- In the future, you may be invited to provide additional samples for ongoing research. Rest assured, we will make necessary accommodations to ensure your comfort during this process.
- Agree to be contacted in the future regarding potential participation in research studies, including clinical trials. Your individual circumstances will be taken into account, and we will only reach out if we believe you are a suitable candidate. Remember, there is absolutely no obligation to participate, and your decision will be respected. We will also ensure that you are compensated for any travel expenses when required, acknowledging the potential additional barriers faced by disabled individuals. Please note that some research may not require further involvement from you, as the samples and data you provide may be sufficient.
- You may choose to withdraw from the BioResource at any time. This process is simple and straightforward, requiring only a phone call or email to our team.

We genuinely value your contributions as a participant with disabilities. You are a vital part of our research community, and we are dedicated to providing a supportive and inclusive environment throughout this journey.
