## Becoming a Participant

You can be living with a particular health condition, or you can be a healthy volunteer – either way, your input could be vital in helping us and others to conduct ground-breaking research. If you would like to get involved, all we ask is some basic information (in the form of a data collection sheet and a questionnaire), and a small blood or saliva sample. This information and sample will be used to match you with studies that aim to look at how genes influence our health, or trials that look to identify new or more effective treatments for certain conditions.
